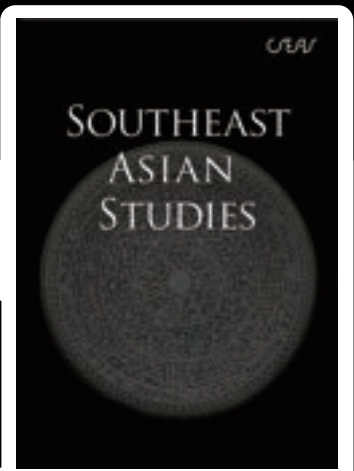


SOUTHEAST ASIAN STUDIES

To this end, the journal welcomes accessibly written articles that build on insights and cutting-edge research from the natural sciences.
